Birds Reported in Allegheny County – 2003

Birders found 222 species plus a hybrid Brewster's Warbler in Allegheny County during 2003 five more species than the tally in 2002. The best birds were the county's second records of Lesser Black-backed Gull and Swainson's Warbler. Other rarities included White-winged Scoter, Surf Scoter, Snow Bunting, Clay-colored Sparrow, and Brewer's Blackbird.

The Lesser Black-backed Gull was discovered by Dave Wilton on December 6 at Dashields on the Ohio River. It did not stay long enough for more than a few fast-moving birders to see it. The Swainson's Warbler was found by Chris Knoll at Sewickley Heights Park on May 9. It remained until at least May 16 - long enough for many observers to see it and hear the species' characteristically loud and oddly ventriloquial song.
